VFW National - VFW Disaster Assistance Tops \$680,000

KANSAS CITY. MO

(January 26, 2018) - The VFW is proud to announce that its VFW Unmet Needs program provided a total of \$684,000 in disaster assistance grants to help more than 2,050 military and veteran families recover from last year's string of natural disasters. .

The relief funds aided more than 1,063 families after Hurricane Harvey, 925 families after

Hurricanes Maria and Irma and more than 40 families after the California wildfires.

In addition to the monetary support provided by the VFW National, many local VFW members quickly joined relief efforts in their own devastated communities. When members of VFW

Post 4709 in Conroe, Texas discovered their Red Cross couldn't reach several emergency shelters, they prepared and shipped out three meals a day for nearly 2,000 people.

Members of Puerto Rico VFW Post 12064 helped distribute water and nearly 1,00 meals to struggling veterans, as well as helped others with debris removal to receive health care, find temporary housing, and by connecting them with the correct government agencies to help get them back to their feet.

The VFW projects tha by the end of the fiscal year, nearly 2,400 grants will be distributed, surpassing \$786K in disaster aid.

"The VFW is extremely proud of the fact we can provide a lifeline for so many military and veteran families, especially during an already trying time in their lives," said VFW National Commander Keith Harman. "This program really showcases what we do, and have always done to support America's service members.

Virginia DVS - Virginia War Memorial Honors African American Vets

RICHMOND, VA - The Virginia War Memorial 2018 Black History Month Series will present special programs honoring the contributions of African American military veterans during February.

On Saturday, February 17 at 2 PM, the Memorial will present "Our Fathers' Fight for Freedom." The program will include stories told by sons of World War II veterans,

the late Howard Baugh, Sr., on of the original Tuskegee Airmen who flew 135 combat missions in Europe, and the late George Bland, who was serving on the USS West Virginia and injured during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941.



The program will be presented at the Memorial in Richmond. Admission is free and the public is encouraged to attend.

About the Virginia War Memorial

The mission of the Virginia War Memorial is to Honor Veterans, Preserve History, Educate Youth and Inspire Patriotism in All. Dedicated in 1956, the memorial includes the names of nearly 12,000 Virginia heroes who made the ultimate sacrifice during World War II, Korea, Vietnam, the Persian Gulf and the Global War on Terrorism. The Virginia War Memorial is a division of
